



These efforts are carried out collectively and in collaboration with the Government, Line Deptt, Stake Holders and Civil society organizations in order to make children's issues a priority on our Agenda. In addition, CHILDLINE discusses and dialogues with its network through various meets which result in universal programs and protocols to build an effective Child Protection practice.

Advocacy on Children's Issues forms one of the core pillars of ISRD's efforts towards creating a child-friendly Society. These advocacy and networking initiatives are practiced from the Village Panchayat level to the State and National level. These developments have significantly contributed to CHILDLINE's growth in promoting Child Rights and Child Protection.

Our commitment and priority lies in creating a protective environment for our children. There is a dire need to ensure that Child Protection is understood and practiced by all who are stakeholders in ensuring the rights of a child. Catalyzing allied systems including the Police, Health Care Organizations, Education Institutions, Transport Undertakings, Telecom, Media and NGO's who have a large stake in Child Protection is vital in order to create a more sensitive and proactive society.






Iv) Associate CHILDLINE



CAMPAIGN AGAINST VIOLENCE ON CHILDREN

(National Level Civil Society Network)

ISRD has since last 03 years been heading a Campaign against Violence on Children. Children often are susceptible various abuse & exploitation. It affects the physical, mental, spiritual & social well being of children. At home, at school & in institution they are subject to physical, mental & sexual abuse. Above all discrimination to girl child is also violence of child rights. At present we at ISRD are planning to convert Ganjam in to a Violence Free Child Friendly district in coordination with likeminded forums, NGOs, CSOs to fight against all forms of violence on children

OPEN SHELTER

The ISRD Open Shelter program is running at Neelanchal Nagar, 1st Lane, Brahmapur. It has three contact points at Hilpatna, Swarnamayee Nagar & TATA colony. During 2020-2021 case turnover of the Open shelter

was 52. Inmates of open shelter are provided with health, education, nutrition and recreational facilities. Indoor games provided are Ludo, Carom, Ring ball, Chess etc. Working children, orphan, deserted, trafficked, begging, run away children are the immediate beneficiaries of the program. Similarly, another Transit point for children in need in urban and semi urban areas has been functioning under the ISRD at Uppalada of



Gajapati district since the year 2011. The turnover of the transit point was 31 during 2020-21

Residential High School

The Maa Kandhuni Devi High School (MKDHS), Gajalbadi in Sorada block of Ganjam is a residential high school founded and undertaken by the ISRD. The high school was established in the year 1996. There is 12 teaching and non-teaching staff. Similarly another ISRD founded high school namely ISRD Budharaja High School is functioning in Ravanaguda of Nawrangpur district. Besides curriculum based academic teaching students are also imparted knowledge on yoga, value, rich cultural heritage of India etc.

SC/ST Hostel

For tribal marginalized community especially for SC/ST students the ISRD has established a hostel at Gajalbadi of Ganjam the premier objective being to provide tribal students coming from far off places with the facilities of lodging and boarding, nutritional support and study care. In the preceding years the ISRD SC/ST students' hostel has producing good talented learners. The routine work of the SC/ST students' hostel include medical treatment, health check up, sports and indoor and outdoor games facility etc. Special attention and coaching is given to the inmates. Students are also given trainings on qualities of leadership and personality development.

CHILDREN'S CLUB

Total 126 children clubs in Ganjam district & 47 Children's Club in Gajapati district formed & functionalized in rural and urban slums towards ensure the child rights of children.

vii. After Care

The After Care program mainly is for the children in need of care & protection once they attained the age of 18. Parentless, Single parent & other vulnerable children are who are in difficult circumstances and are need of immediate care and protection are identified under orphan survey drive & provided skill training & ultimate placement in different Companies all over India. During 2020-2021. 21 no.s of children placed under after care were obtained placement after due completion of the training period.

viii. Youth Counseling & Career Guidance

Youth mass of our society being the future of our nation are the major stakeholder of the ISRD ventures. Tribal children, poor students, 10th pass outs are provided counseling & career guidance at regular intervals. Academic, technical, business, entrepreneurship guidance provided to the aspirants to build their future in a proper way. During 2020-2021. 152 nos. of such programs were organized as detailed below benefiting our young generation.

International No Child Labour Day

On 12.06.2020 the international day against child labour was observed in Utkala Balashrama, Brahmapur. The program was jointly organized by CHILDLINE & Labour Department. All members of ISRD-CHILDLINE children club and all inmates of Utkala Balashrama interacted with each other, shared their life style in the ceremony organized throughout the day. Competition, Debate Competition, Song Competition etc... 1st started the drawing competition. Drawing sheet, pencil, eraser, sharpener, color etc. organized by ISRD organization.

All tool kit distributed to the children. At 11:30 am, the drawing competition began and topic was Child Labor & end at 1:00 pm. At 1:00 pm started debate competition, the topic was Child labor is a hateful & also shared their feelings by participants & ended at 2:00 pm. Then all children & staff took their lunch. After the lunch all staff & children went to hall & saw some film related to Child Labor. After some time we started song competition. It was basically on patriotic songs and three juries also judging the children. Media person also came to coverage our programme. At 3:00 pm the song competition started & ended at 5:00 pm. Then all children with staff had gone to Human chain from Bijipur square to Balashram. Human chain basically done for public awareness, solidarity lead by ISRD staff members & other staff members.

Yoga for Teachers

ISRD in collaboration with the Art of Living (AOL)have been imparting yoga training to teachers & children. Usually the contents of Training include: - i. Yoga, ii. Surya Namashkar, iii. Sudarshan kriya, iv. Games, v. Satsang & Sweet Distribution, vi. Speech by AOL Senior Teacher. The observation of the yoga camps remarkably has reduced the mental & emotional stress among the disciples, after practicing Yoga they feel fit from all angles, By Satsang they are given the message of spirituality & divine life. During summer vacation 30 teachers were trained on yoga. Period of training was from 2nd September to 09th September 2020.

Yoga for Children's

The divine and spiritual base of India is so deep that India is very often considered the spiritual leader of the world. For foreigners this is a land of miracles. For historian A.L. Basham this is "The wonder that is India". But the penetration of western culture, Globalisation, Cyber net has badly affected the mental, physical and social and spiritual health and life styles of the people of India. In every sphere there is a trend of unrest. Parents, teachers, students, politician, businessmen, intellectually are also not devoid of the turmoil. Social crimes, Juvenile delinquency, Violence against mother cult, Disregard to elders are in the offing. The incidences of mental stress and hypertension are increasing rapidly. Since thousands of years India has been blessed with the wisdom of yoga and naturopathy.

But majority of the people including adolescent boys and girls have no knowledge on "Yoga". The only requirement of our time/age is to infuse "Yoga" among the masses/school students for promotion of mental and physical health, for balance between body and mind, for improvement of way of living of people. To add further due to the pressure and depression of modern living, negative emotions get stored in every cell of our body in the form of toxins. In order to tackle with these negative forces there is a great need of Yoga courses for different stakeholders. The corner stone of the course is a revitalizing and unique breathing technique known as the Sudarshan Kriya which releases stress and toxins at the physical, mental and emotional level, thereby promoting the physical, mental, spiritual and social health of individuals. Against the above perspective the ISRD had has been implementing the following yoga programs at different points of time.

Inclusive Campaigning & Campaign for Rights of the Dalit

Till today even after 67 years of independence MDM feelings continue in schools. So the ISRD had organized attitude and behavior change program at different places during 2020-21.

The ISRD works on the issue of social inclusion of dalits in Aska, Sorada, Hinjilicut, Chikiti, Kabisurya Nagar, Dharakote, Kukudakhandi, Digapahandi, Polasara, Purusottampur, Rangeilunda, Patrapur blocks of Ganjam district, Paralakhemundi & Rayagada blocks of Gajapati district, Dabugam & Papadahandi blocks of Nawrangpur district & Daringbadi and Raikia blocks of Kandhamal district. Our interventions mainly include village sensitization meetings, awareness and leaflet campaign to combat untouchability/discrimination, creating public opinion to main stream the dalits, organizing of dalit childrens' rally, district & state level advocacy to mainstream the dalits, block level workshops & consultation for well being of dalits.

Child Friendly School Campaigning

It has been the constant endeavour of ISRD to make schools safe for children. The Safe School campaign is meant to sensitize community, teachers, students, parents, school management committee, local authority, policy makers, implementers & monitoring agencies, Civil Society organizations, Media etc for a collective action towards ending all forms of discrimination, abuse and violence against children in schools and make the environment conducive, child friendly and enjoyable for children and to learn without fear.


i) One Stop Centre



SWADHAR GRUHA

The ISRD being a Women and child centric organization is successfully implementing the centrally sponsored flagship"Short Stay Home (SSH)" Program at Hatapada of Dabugan block in Nabarangpur district of Odisha since last 2000. Average Inmates per month in the said Home during FY 2015-16 was 34nos., now which has come to a figure of 42 in FY2020-21.

In flashback, the so-called Short-Stay Home, with the gradient of time, acquired the status that of a "SWADHAR HOME in January 2016 as per orders



issued by CSWB (Central Social Welfare Board), MoW&CD. A wide genre of vulnerable girls & women being victimized and fallen a prey to sundry atrocities seek shelter in SSH among whom there are – Victims of GBV, Victims of cruelty, Victims of Sexual Exploitation, Marital maladjustment, Woman in Moral Danger, Divorcee, Survivors of forced Marriage, Rescued from Trafficking etc., referred by the district/local administration or PRI members/CDPOs are accommodated in the SSH and provided nutritional support, legal aid, counseling, rehabilitative training etc. Vocational training in trades of Agarbati making, Tailoring& Embroidery, Soft-Toy making, Appliqué Work, Coir Décor, Mushroom Cultivation, Spices preparation, Badi, Papad & Pickles, Candle, Detergent Preparation etc. are given to the inmates. Stress & Strain free Sessions on Yoga are alsoimparted to them as additional priorities.

Victim of cruelty, marital maladjustment, woman in moral danger, divorcee, survivors of forced marriage and trafficking referred by the district/local administration or PRI members/CDPOs are accommodated in the SSH and provided nutritional support, legal aid, counseling, rehabilitative training etc. Vocational training in trades of Agarbati making, tailoring, soft toy, appliqué, coir décor, mushroom cultivation, spices preparation, badi, papad & pickles, candle, detergent preparation etc are given to the inmates. To make them stress & strain free lesson on Yoga is also provided to the inmates. Follows below the month wise position of residents of ISRD SWADHAR, Dabugam..

SOCIO ECONOMIC BOOSTING OF MOTHERS

The core philosophy of the ISRD is to ensure the survival, nutrition, education, participation & empowerment of the mother cult. Our integrated ventures on socio economic development of mothers include formation of mothers Self Help Groups, establishing Mahila Mandals. The premier motto of these drives is to strengthen the rural economy by bringing desired change in the living standards of mothers housewives. They promote income generation programs & encourage savings. They rotate money among

themselves at lowest rate of interest for undertaking different income generation activities by the members like stitching leaf plates and cups, processing and marketing of tamarind, collection of broomstick, turmeric and other minor forest products. Besides, they are also trained in poultry, goatery, pisci culture, soft toy, tailoring, coir craft, leaf plate stitching, bamboo and paper work etc. We also promote kitchen garden to checkmate IMR/MMR and malnourishment etc. But for these initiatives of ISRD women migration, exploitation & wage labour has reduced to a considerable extent in the area. Thus, women are playing a major role in adding to family income and strengthening rural economy. They could pay for food & schooling of their children, medical treatment of the diseased, festival, wedding, cultivation cost, care of older person etc. Above all they have developed self esteem in them. Mothers have been instrumental in spreading girl child education, stop drug and alcohol in the village, establishing gender justice, awareness generation on government schemes for women and girl children etc.

UJJAWALA:

In the year 2020-21 the ISRD implemented the Ujjawala project in Ganjam district. The major objective of the program is to prevent the heinous human trafficking especially trafficking of adolescent children for commercial and sexual exploitation. Brief activities of ISRD Ujjawala program is outlined below for kind reference.

Child protection issues like trafficking, child exploitation, migrant child labour, etc were discussed in the meetings.

Sensitization Workshop

On 12.12.2020 one community sensitization workshop was organized at ISRD training centre, Gajalbadi, Ganjam. 225 villagers had attended the program. They were sensitized on who is a child, has the child any right, what are child rights, major child protection issues in the district, strengthening of child right to education, preventing child marriage, family strengthening etc. Assemble common men asked different questions on child education & child labour. The resource persons lucidly explained the answers before them. Subject experts who attended the program were Director, ISRD, Secretary, NIRMATA, Centre Coordinator, CHILDLINE & Support CHILDLINE.

Awareness Generation Program

In the year 2020-2021 village level awareness generation programs on human trafficking & its disadvantages was organized by the ISRD through street plays amounting to 11. Cultural team headed by Sri Balaram Panda performed street plays to generate massive awareness against violation of child rights & human trafficking. street plays organized is diffrrent parts of Ganjam District.

The foregoing street plays carried the message that

- Every Child is Important
- Zero tolerance for Child labour
- Child Marriage is pernicious
- Under ICPS different service providers are working in the district.
- Child involvement in decision making process
- Child friendly family & Safe School
- RTE Act ensures free and compulsory education

Rescue from Trafficking

Under Ujjawala program victims of human trafficking were rescued by the ISRD throughout the year. In this connection we have developed strong networking with the government railway police, railway protection force, railway child assistance booth, the VCPC and CHILDLINE volunteers etc

Rehabilitation

In post rescue period of tribal children by proper counseling & consent of the child & her parents they were housed in open shelter Berhampur as special case by orders of the CWC, Ganjam. Nine numbers of girl children were admitted in K. C. Girls High School, Brahmapur & were provided with fooding, clothing, health & sanitation amenities in the open shelter. Childhood was awarded with proper justice by the earnest endeavour of ISRD. Name of the children who were covered under rehabilitative measures follows below. Local youth groups have been created to play the role of watch dog in combating trafficking. Effort has been made to strengthen the district anti human trafficking unit.

Reintegration

70 out of 79 rescued children were provided proper counseling in ISRD. They were made aware on the grave consequences of human trafficking, particularly on health & mind of the victim. Parents of the survivors of trafficking were also sensitized on the ITPA Act, CLPR Act, CMR Act, J.J.Act etc. All of them given written undertaking in CHILDLINE office not to push their children into the gulf of exploitation by the merciless hands of traffickers/middlemen.

Information, Education & Communication materials developed on child protection, female foeticide & anti human trafficking and child right protection mechanism under the Integrated Child Protection Scheme. Since the year 2011 the ISRD-UJJWALA (Anti-Human Trafficking) Prevention program has been implemented in Ganjam district. Premier motto is to checkmate the pernicious trafficking of human beings especially minor and adolescent children for child labour and sexual exploitation. Mostly we focus on the vulnerable pockets of Ganjam. The activities of ISRD Ujjawala program during 2020-21 as per sanctioned components are described in the succeeding paragraphs

Promoting Women PRIs / Parliamentarians

Panchayat Raj Institutions (PRIs) are viewed as solution to all the problems of rural development and is linked to empowerment of the marginalized section of society, especially women. The empowerment of women representatives in PRIs with reference to decentralization process and the 73rd constitutional amendment in India covering the level of awareness among representatives about panchayat functioning, capacity to take self-decision, participation in community activities, changes in their socio-economic conditions, decision making power at panchayat level and their political participation. The participation of women representatives including members from weaker sections appears to have increased substantially over the years mainly on account of affirmative action. Various studies indicate that women leaders are less corrupt, are able to provide more public goods of equal quality at effective price and consider women's preferences to improve overall governance.

SKILL DEVELOPMENT

1. Tracking RURAL ENTERPRISEs and SKILL Needs of Communities through NEED Assessment Exercises:

Much enough before the launch of the "Skill INDIA Mission" by the central Govt. s one flagship initiative, it was one of the core prioritised tasks with the developing ideologies, emerging concerns and indigenous strategies of ISRD to give a vent to the budding ideas, zeal, efforts and enthusiasm of the locale Youth and Artisans within its' operation locale. And with the gradual flow of time, ISRD started provided these youths to finally meet-out their long-cherished aspirations on an appropriate platform through "Vocational IGP-based Trainings, now-a-Days, tailor-made as SKILL /Entrepreneurship Development Training". ISRD, thus, ensured its' entrant into the SKILL Development arena almost since a decade back with couple of Programs organized for limited Target Groups and Beneficiaries.

To get its work done, ISRD explored the nooks & corners of its' operational area as well as of the district and nearby Districts to track-out ethnically sound socio-economic SKILLs or proven skilled mechanisms to ensure greater livelihood sustainability of the pro-poor vulnerable communities across its' operational locale. The key objective behind this inventory initiative intended towards – (a) Tracking the ethnic and highly profitable socio-economic Skills and existing Artisans and their Entrepreneurial Units, (b) Ensure them Bank & Market Linkage with Govt. Schemes & Programs and ensure them commercial Stability, (C) Mobilize local unemployed Youths and Communities to avail Skill-based Training with all Govt. Supports, (d) Set-Up their own entrepreneurial Units or join the Market or existing Production Units through ample practical exposure for leading a sustainable

and successful life, (e) safeguard and promote ethnic Skill-based Arts while safeguarding **ethnic Culture & Tradition** With added **cultural heritage**. The inventory mechanisms routed-out as such were enough to arouse the curiosity of the rural communities to come forward and get involved in the "Vocational world of technical as well as creative productivity coupled with ample scope of healthy source of Income Generation

and Employment thereafter". And this was the reason for their knee-vested interest and participation in large numbers all over from ISRD operational area.

2. AWARENESS DRIVEs on flagship SKILL-DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMs:

ISRD usually strategized repeating this inventory exercise twice and thrice a year in different zones and locales in undivided Ganjam Dist., now geographically recognized as duo-Districts viz., Ganjam and Gajapati District. ISRD, in-association with LSG administration, have started collaborative initiatives towards sensitizing and orienting its' operational communities on prospective dynamics of getting skilled with wide range of existing and newer demandable Skills of sustainable "Livelihood & Income Generation Approaches" those need to be adopted as permanent Occupations for making a living & lifestyle. The Process is all active and still in continuance as one "Best-Practice" to track and mobilise the requisite Target Groups to get skilled for handling the "Natural Flora" in-abundance for effective usage by the human-race and its' sustainability thereafter. Moreover, the endeavour primarily targeted at "Bringing equilibrium to the SUPPLY-DEMAND Scenario existing in a particular market-based setting by facilitating flow of requisite human resources to ensure accountability as SERVICE-DELIVERY Entities to offer and fulfil common requirements needed in day-to-day life through market-based approach with ample commercial dividends in-return.

With the launch of the Skill-INDIA Mission and other such initiatives viz., DDU-GKY and an array of similar other programs, ISRD has been a consistent and frontline role-player is disseminating the strategies of the state /Dist. Administration in channelizing the so-callled flagship endeavours at par. It has been one of the core supporting agencies of the Dist. Concerned Unit viz., of the DIC of duo-Districts Ganjam and Gajapati for mobilising Youths and unemployed target groups to gain out of these broader initiatives.

As one dominant civil role-player in the State, ISRD since its' inception has championed in the trade of "Information Dissemination to the greater audience i.e., to the rural citizenry". It thus, hereby, has made usage of those information dissemination techniques for greater mobilization of anticipated beneficiaries to avail benefits under the prospective Skill Development priorities. ISRD, thus, adopts communication approaches viz., Mike Announcements, Print Media /TV /Radio and-Advertisements, Walling & Postering, Leaflet & Flyer Distribution, Street-Plays etc. for the sake of effective information dissemination.

A Couple of "Advance Programs organized in-form of Trainings & Expoures for local Youths" in this concern are as follows:

a. Youth Adventure program:

Series of Youth Adventure Programs were organized from 14.12.2017 to 31.03.2019 at identified locations of the District. 59 rural Youths from different youth clubs of the district attended the program in large numbers. 29no. of adolescent girls and 40 boys took active participation in the said expedition. The Adventure initiative was lead by Ms Pranati Kaur as the Team-Lead. Similar programs conducted across the operational area invited sensuous community and LSG applaud.

b. Youth Leadership Training:

In a stereotype fashion unlike the "Adventure Program", another program launched was the "Youth Leadership Training" meant to track, select and pluck-out enthusiast and industrious Youths /Youth. Talents with visible characteristic traits that of future Entrepreneurs to lead their region and district as well

by establishing own Enterprises catering to their local and regional needs. A series of these Trainings were conducted from 17.09.2017 to 31.01.20 in different identified locations f the district. The Training also focussed upon shortlisting and mobilising Youth Talents to emerge as future Entrepreneurs with a probable anticipation to get involved in the Skill Development Trainings. The Workshop timings lasted from 5-7hrs. With the growing enthusiasm and craze of the participants involved. A total of 470 Youths participated in the activities organized at different locations of the District. Notable Resource Persons (RPs) – Mr. Krushnakant Mohapatra, Mr. Prabhu Prasad Patro, Asst. Director – ISRD, and Mr. Sarbeswar Mohapatra facilitated the Events as usual at different strategic Training Venues.

The Short Term Training for fresh skilling of school student / college drop outs and unemployed youth, Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) to recognize the existing skills and to address skilling requirements of the vulnerable groups and permit flexibility in conduct of Short Term Training. 11 training courses in Beekeeping & 6 training courses in Floriculturist, Gardener, Pulses Cultivator, Animal husbandry has been done by ISRD. The beneficiaries have been oriented in skills such as 'Group Farming Practitioner' which enables farmers to increase productivity and income by establishing market linkages and buy – back arrangements.

3. Financial Literacy Programs for SHGs and YOUTHs:

The simple, easy-going rustic folklore based in the pro-tribal rural settings of the duo-districts are continuously being incubated for recognizing accurate and appropriate economic and financial dynamics towards adopting sustainable "Income Generation Practices and Vocations /Occupations for Livelihood Sustainability (IGLS)". Accordingly, these target groups are offered comprehensive orientation & sensitization programs for friendly and effective learning, simply, on recording their Income & Expenditures, doing easy mathematic Calculations and recording requisite Figures as memory for reference and instant use, learning simple Banking & Commercial Transactions and gaining knowledge on economically beneficial govt. Poverty-alleviation Schemes & Programs etc.

4. Income Generation Program (IGP) -based SKILL Development Program for Disables:

A visible chunk of the population across every human habituation /Settling consists of the DISABLE or Handicapped Persons who are considered as "Dependants on their Parents, Siblings or earning Members of their Family. Keeping this dynamics in-view, ISRD propelled a thought forward for their greater prosperity through their "Skill-based Incubation in variety of Income-Generation Programs (IGPs), which, they will adopt as their lifelong occupation and means of livelihood. Accordingly. ISRD have organized a series of "IGP-based Skill Development Trainings for those Persons with Disabilities within its' operational area". A wide variety of comprehensive Training are imparted to them on IGP indigenous and latest techniques /technologies viz., on Electrician Trade, Tailoring, Mushroom Cultivation, Organic Farming, Poultry, Animal Husbandry, pisciculture, Cycle-Repairing, Nursery Raising, Canning, Carpentry, Bamboo Works, Tapestry, Photo-Binding, TV /Radio & Electrical Gadget Repairing, Fan & Water Pump /Motor Winding, Xerox & Lamination, Mobile Repairing, and a series of other such locally viable trades /skills of extreme local importance and overnight Demand. This year, ISRD did again, organized number of Trainings for the Disabled persons detailed here-as-under:

5. SKILL /Entrepreneurship Development (EDP) for YOUTH and SHGs:

ISRD, especially, targeted the unemployed Youths and SHG Members from the down-trodden, vulnerable and pro-poor tribal and general communities to be trained and incubated as "Trainees" under its' continuing "**Skilling Endeavours**" with various stakeholders viz., with Dist. /State departmental counterparts under the broad banner of govt. Flagship initiatives, as a need assessment emerging out of its' inventories

with MSM Entrepreneurial Units, with locally and outdoor-based corporate and with emerging needs of the govt. Machinery and stakeholders at times. Another reason behind the selection of SHGs and Youths is that, they form a group and a combined force focussing on a particular aspect in a like-minded approach, who again, possess all potentials to unleash their enormous energy, vivacity and zest to yield a "Healthy Harvest of anything they plunge into" credibly coupled with vibrant group-spirit and fortified enthusiasm. And these are, essentially, the appropriate human resources, those can burden the responsibility of bringing in drastic changes for development of Self, of their Families /Communities and of the overall Society as-a-whole.

6. Entrepreneurship Development Program for Artisan / Farmers:

ISRD being a silent witness to the trend of "Livelihod Systems & Sustainability Trends of Rural Lifestyle", primarily, nurtures the belief that the "Farmers along with the Farming Community including those workers /labourers engaged in the Farm, Off-Farm and Non-Farm activities added with a second category of people titled ARTISANs and TECHNICIANs" are those sections of people amidst the widespread communities, who possess a credible zeal and an inherent instinct for pursuing pro-economic excellence in-terms of getting a healthy harvest and again in-terms of getting a healthy financial return throughout their life with the key intent of day-to-day development in their living standard as a Well-To-Do societal entity. And this is the prime reason behind their pro-industrious and bounce-back nature irrespective of all hardships, oddities and natural calamities. They are chiefly concerned and concentrated for their prime occupation to input their labour and output a healthy Harvest and are among the least communities to miss their objective-led priorities and targets and hence are pro-committed.

In compliance to this viewpoint, ISRD organized a variety of Skill /Entrepreneurial Trainings in-series for these Artisans and Farmer Group /Federation Members so as to ensure and strengthen their livelihood sustainability, side-by-side, catalysing the regional harvesting paradigms at par for greater interest of the Dist. and of the State. Below furnished are the details of similar Trainings /Workshops organized at ISRDs end this year:

7. Skill-based Vocational Training for OBC and SEBC Youth:

Govt. of India, laying added emphasis on categorical development, especially, of the SEBC Communities with last couple of concurrent Five-Year Plans, ISRD has branded this initiative since then for rigorous training of OBC and SEBC Section Youths, SHGs and seasonally-employed households to be a part of the progressively continuing SKILLING SAGA and enable themselves impart a new dimension and a changed scenario to their existing lifestyle and societal status-quo. Under above realm, ISRD has paced ahead towards organizing a series of Skill-based Vocational Training Sessions for these typical communities since last eleven years in the different traded enumerated.

8. INDUSTRY Visits & SKILL-Specific EXPOSUREs:

Industry Visits are planned Skill-Exposures for all the Trainees of Skill-based and Vocational Trainings. It is a pertinent requirement to acquire the technologically practical Know-How of the mechanisms and portions covered in the theoretical capacity-building exercises. In-addition, it allows a particular Trainee to anticipate and acknowledge a greater conceptualization of technical facts and critical steps of the comprehensively involved procedure. The more the practical clarity, more broad becomes the vision and perception of associated dynamics thereafter.

Developing a **DATABASE** of MSM Entrepreneurial Units / Settlings and Industries / Corporate Houses nearby, ISRD has organized several "Industry Visits or Skill-based Exposures for the Trainees (**SHGs, Youths, Artisans, Farmers / Producer Groups, Disables**)" incubated under different Skill-Programs every year. The Visits and Exposures organized for the Trainees in the reporting year are enlisted.

9. CAREER COUNSELLING & YOUTH / Artisan PLACEMENT / Engagement:

Artisan and Skilled Trainee Engagement or Placement brings in the requisite "Turning-Point in the Skill-based and Entrepreneur Development Training curricula", that is the top-most and vital aspect that emerges as the Output with the entire incubation process. It is the most sensitive phase, whereby, a Trainee gathers all potentials to unleash the same through establishment of some micro, small or medium Enterprise. On the other hand, the same Trainee or group of Trainees launch the expedition in-quest of an engagement with some Entrepreneurial Unit /House, with some rural /local or outdoor industry for his /her placement accordingly.

ISRD, accordingly, organized a number of "Career Counselling and Placement / Engagement Exercises" at both the ends, viz., held dialogues with Entrepreneurial Units / Industries for assessing their emerging needs & requirements, and on the other hand, it discussed with the Trained-Hands for their engagement based on their personal preferences to the type of Work / Labour, Pay-Perks and Returns / Dividends, Distance from Home etc., so as to ensure its' mediary role-play for greater benefit of the Trained Human Resource.

10. BANK & MARKET LINKAGE - of SHGs and their Integration with IGPs and ED Programs:

This Exercise unlike the previous one is, once again, a crucial step for those highly enthusiastic budding Entrepreneurs who nurture a "Die-Hard Instinct" to establish their enterprise by hook or crook at the cost of anything. They carry a stead forward vision for the same with sleepless and restless Eyes concentrating only on their "Dream Project". And these typically are those "Individual Trainees – those need the Support of establishing their much aspired Enterprises through robust standby mechanisms viz., through BANK & MARKET Linkages", those are essential pre-requisites for any enterprise to exist, bloom and prosper.

ISRD boastfully extends this crucially credible support to shortlisted Trainee Entrepreneurs having placed their must needs and emerging requirements accordingly. Below furnished is the list of the Trainees provided with "BANKING & MARKET LINKAGE" in earmarked regions for establishment of Units enumerated.

HEALTH THE NECTAR OF LIFE

i) Disable Resource Centre

In our social & family set up differently able person are often found discriminated and neglected. The ISRD initiative has created assurance for the differently able children to live a life of dignity with rights & comforts of childhood. Major focus of ISRD is to provide eye care facility to the low vision children. One Low Vision Centre is in operation by the ISRD at Gajalbadi of Sorada block. The technical and supportive hands have been providing

assessment, diagnosis, rehabilitation & counseling services which certainly helped the persons with low vision to live an independent life in the community. Due to causes like measles, exophthalmia, cataract, glaucoma the incidence of low vision has been up in the rural pockets. Hence mobile eye care camps were organized by the ISRD technical team. During the year 2020-2021, 325 cases of low vision handled successfully.

ii) Mobile Medicare Unit for Old Age

The ISRD has been implementing Mobile Health Unit in Gajapati District. It is a mockery that senior citizens are not looked after properly by their children. Sons and daughter-in-laws are seen ignoring the requirements and expectations of their old father and mother. Being concerned the ISRD has been implementing MHU program for addressing to the health issues of old aged persons through its mobile medicare unit. Health services provided to the senior citizens at their doorstep. Stress and strain relief sessions also taken for them In 2020-2021 nos. of older persons in Gajapati district were benefited by the intervention of the ISRD mobile medicare unit for the older persons.

iii) Physiotherapy & Yoga Centre

In Gajapati district the ISRD is also running a physiotherapy centre& Yoga Centre at Indira Nagar, Parlakhemundi. Physical therapy helps people of all ages who have medical conditions, illnesses or injuries that limit their regular ability to move and function. A customized physical therapy program can help individuals return to their prior level of functioning, and encourage activities and lifestyle changes that can



help prevent further injury and improve overall health and well being. Physiotherapy reduce pain, avoid surgery, mprove mobility, improve balance & prevent falls, manage diabetes & vascular conditions, manage age related issues, manage heart & lung diseases etc. In the year 2020-2021 totally 301 nos. of people were benefited by the physiotherapy & yoga centre of ISRD.

Strengthening Mental Health of Children

Loss of moral values in the society is of great concern. Our young generation is in the threshold of moral degradation. Mental & spiritual depression is rampant among students. They face emotional problems pertaining to their parents, friends, career, unfriendly situation, unhealthy environment etc. During the year 2017-2020 our team successfully provided emotional support and guidance to 136 numbers of children in the age group of 12-18 and 18-21

 - Collecting follow-up from the school/AWC/ASHA worker
 - Collecting dropout status from school/office of the BEO
 - Collecting different issues of children from the village and block level
 - Opening of parks and beaches for entertainment of children
 - Assessment of COVID-19 test with children
 - Organising Awareness/Open House/Children Engagement program

At the time of Covid-19, ISRD has distributed dry food with cooking hot food, Sanitary utensils/ kit , distribution among not only Women & Children but also all distress condition people. ISRD covered 5352 people including women & Children.

ISRD rose to the occasion immediately and had its disaster preparedness mock drill in BMC slum, Rangailunda, Chikiti, Purusottampur & Chatrapur blocks in Ganjam district and Parlakhemundi Municipality, Gosani Block,Rayagada Block and also Emergency need assessment and community contingence plan was made in all the operational areas.

AGRICULTURE

Small Farmers Agriculture Business

It has been our constant effort to conserve and develop degraded private lands owned by the poor farmers through water and soil conservation measures to enhance livelihoods. Petty farmers are benefited by this drive. Online Meeting were conducted on 6th May 2020 one awareness meeting of small farmers & new technology demonstration was done before the small farmers.

Watershed Development

In Sarapanka village under Gochha gram panchayat the farmers are sensitized on water harvesting and watershed development. They are said on various water sources like fountain, rain water, irrigation etc. So, they could grow crops better in their agriculture land.

Bamboo Craft & Livelihood

In Gajalbadi area of Sorada block ISRD has been working for the well being of the Bamboo cutters family. In a year the family of bamboo cutters gets four to six months work. Rest of the month they sit without any earning. During the transit period ISRD personnel mobilize and train them on alternative livelihood options like rice puff unit, poultry, kitchen garden, goatery etc. We also endeavour to tie up the bamboo cutters with different poverty alleviation programs launched by the government

SWACHH BHARAT AVIYAN

The ISRD possess a store of working experiences in National Youth Project. We mobilize youth, childrens club, slum children & common mass to fructify the Swachh Bharat aviyan. Drawing, debate, essay, mehendi, painting competition organized among children to generate & spread the message that sanitation is a way of life. Without following sanitary principles we cannot term us as a member of a civic society. We also organize public meetings and mass rally, mini marathon to keep our city town village clean & healthy. During 2020-2021 Swachh Bharat Aviyan under the ISRD is as follows.

Throughout the year the ISRD organize different capacity building programs for its project staffs working the districts of Ganjam, Gajapati &Nawrangpur. In the financial year also following trainings and capacity building programs were organized for our staff.

i) Member in Different Government Cells
