ISRD operates 2no. Childlines' (Collab) in Ganjam and Gajapati districts & Railway Child Help Desk, Eastcoast Railway, Brahmapur Railway Station of Odisha. It is a national 24hr. free emergency Helpline for the marginalized Children providing a range of Intervention Services for "Children in-need of care and protection (CNCP)"

Tends towards creating a region free from Child Abuse, Exploitation, trafficking and Violence; Rescues and restores abandoned and orphan Children.

"Resource Directory" developed from grassroot to District level containing information on related Departments and Service Delivering accountable Institutions /Functionaries. This Database enables us to provide quick and prompt Service to needy children within 15 minutes.

A unique application titled "CHILD WATCH Program" was initiated since 2006" as a default mandate of ISRD for tracking and identifying most vulnerable Children and their families to further plan their protection, development and sustainability.

"Highway Campaigning" is an innovative mechanism to sensitize highway adjacent villages through "Installation & Dissemination of Childline Information" and "Village Committee Formation" for extension of Support.

CHILD MARRIAGE CASE

BACKGROUND OF THE CHILD:

On dated 07-04-2022 a call from a caller who was a Dist. Coordinator Actionaid Mr. Bikash Kumar Maher that a child marriage will be conducted on 08-04-2022 at Big Medhri street, Paralakhemundi the child name is Lopinti Indu (15 Years), D/o: L Surendra & M: L Indrani belongs to ST caste.

DISTRESS SITUATION/CIRCUMSTANCES:

The Girl child was proposed to married a adult of the same village the adult person was very elder from the girl child but he adult person is very rich fromo the girl child so her mother and father agrred to marriage purpose.

IMPACT ON CHILD:

Our team, CWC member, DCPU staff, Action aid staff went to met with the child and family and about the child marriage Act 2006.

CONTACT WITH CHILDLINE:

The case come through by Action aid Dist. Coordinator Mr. Bikash Kumar Mehar.

CHILDLINE INTERVENTION:*After receiving the call immediately communicate with the CMPO, DCPU, CWC Police Gajapati bearing letter No-231/ISR-D-CL/GPT. Then our team went to meet with the child and child family and discussed about the child marriage Act in presence child parents, Word counsellor and relatives all are agreed for stop the child marriage and written a under taking for stop the marriage until completed 18 years of the girl child. The parents advised to production the child before CWC so the child produce before CWC.*

CHILDLINE Impact:

After repeated follow-ups the family and child stated that, the child his good condition. The local persons were positive response towards 1098 for taking this important. The villagers decided that not to do child marriage for father.

Outcome of the case:

The peoples of the villages aware about CHILDLINE service and assured when ever the child marriage was conducted they are informed to CHILDLINE. And also decided that not to do child marriage for further until completes of 18 years of the child.

Present situation:

The child is now at her parents' house and doing tailoring work. And she was very happy now. For the support of CHILDLINE



Support CHILDLINE

CHILDLINE, Gajapati has two support CHILDLINE. One is functioning of the CCWD for Mohana Block & the other is functioning PRABHA for Gumma & Kasi Nagar Block, Gajapati. CHILDLINE, Brahmapur, Ganjam has support CHILDLINE & functioning under the NIRMATA for Rangilunda, Purushotampur, Ganjam & Chhatrapur Block, Ganjam district, Odisha. So far interventions of both the associate ChildLine's include extensive outreach awareness, open house & case intervention as and when assigned by the Collab. Agency, ISRD-CHILDLINE, Ganjam & Gajapati district..

Associate CHILDLINE

ISRD is lead a network a "Campaigning Against Violence On Children" constantly inspired by the challenge to treated as associate CHILDLINE partners to covered at Block level for the nation's progress and aims to continuously add value embracing ETHICAL MEANS and ensuring CHILDRENS DELIGHT with determination and perseverance. Advocacy on Child Rights and Protection forms one of the core objective's effort towards our vision of child-friendly India.

After Care for Gate keeping

It offers multiple skill-based and IG activity Trainings Skills to Youths aged 18-21yrs for 3-Months Training. 15-18yrs. have been imparted skill Training on Computer and Tailoring linked and tied up with "State Poly-Community Technique" and different govt. agencies; negotiations with OLM is spread headed currently for the same. Bridge Course is also imparted to these Youth in association with "National Institute of Open Schooling (NIOS)".

Vulnerable Family Mapping based-on Child Vulnerability has been exercised identifying typical families those are extended livelihood sustainability supports, especially, to the Women, through imparting various skill-based education. These women have developed immense self-esteem and have been contributing extensively to their family sustainability. One of the priority areas for ISRD on child protection is the After Care program for the children in need of care & protection of the age of 18. Parentless, Single parent, Survivors of trafficking, Child marriage rescued, & other vulnerable children are who are in difficult circumstances and are need of immediate care and protection are our immediate beneficiaries. They are provided career counseling, skill training & after due completion of the training period they are placed in different Companies all over India. During 2022-2023 . 29 no.s of children were benefited under after care program of ISRD..

Workshop on "VOICE of Children" – 14th
November, 2022, Sanskruti Bhavan, Brahmapur.

- 869 nos. of Children from 12 nos. of Schools / Slums of Brahmapur City / Municipal Corporation ensured their successful participation in the event.
- Imparted extensive orientation on "Slum & School-led Sanitation & Hygienic Measures", Acknowledging Supportive Child-Friendly Provisions in a School Environment and exercising of Child-Rights, Child Labour dynamics and role & responsibility of Parents / Guardians and Stakeholders etc.

Bal SHAKTI PANCHYAT

ISRD to create model villages in India, which are free from all types of child exploitation and promote child rights issues:

- All children are enrolled and retained in school
- Children form a *Bal Panchayat* (Children's Assembly)
- Children's Assembly gets recognition of *Gram Panchayat* and they work together on all issues related to children
- Empowered and developed village community
- All children are withdrawn from work

Since its inception, this model has been implemented in 12 Gram panchayat in 3 districts i.e. Ganjam, Gajapati & Nabarangapur of Odisha state. The programme directly reached approximately 52,000 people

Child Watch Program:

A unique application titled "CHILD WATCH Program" was initiated since the year 2006 as a default mandate of ISRD for tracking and identifying most vulnerable children and their families to further plan their protection, development and sustainability. Similarly "**National Highway Campaigning**" is an innovative mechanism to sensitize villages adjacent to high way through "Installation & Dissemination of Childline Information" and "Village Committee strengthening" for extension of Support & Alternative Child Care Advocacy initiative. Every year above thousands of children have been benefitted by this initiation of ISRD.

CAMPAIGNING AGAINST VIOLENCE ON CHILDREN:

ISRD has since last 14 years been heading a Campaign Against Violence on Children (CAVC). Children often are susceptible to various abuse & exploitation. It affects the physical, mental, spiritual & social well-being of children. At home, at school & in institution they are subject to physical, mental & sexual abuse. Above all discrimination to girl child is also violence of child rights. At present we at ISRD are planning to convert Odisha into a Violence Free Child Friendly State in coordination with Campaign Against Child Labour (CACL) like-minded forums, NGOs, CSOs to fight against all forms of violence on children.

VOICE OF CACL & CAVC -output

State Govt. declared to "Make Odisha – a Child-Labour Free State in India by 2025".

- Issued State Circular for "25% Reservation for under-privileged BPL-Category Children for admission in all Schools" in-compliance with RTE norms.
- Child Labour Survey approved by the State machinery has been initiated since April 2017, further, strategized (*as a major Demand by CACL*) to be streamlined with consortium approach of Dept. of S & ME /Labour – Govt. of Odisha and the Dist. Administration.

- ISRD successfully have prepared the “DRAFT State Education Policy (SEP)” in-compliance to the “National Education Policy” and have submitted the same with concerned Dept. of the State machinery for finalization;
- ISRD successfully prepared the “DRAFT State Plan of Action for Children (SPAC)” in-compliance to the National Plan of Action for Children (NPAC);
- CACL / CAVC successfully raised crucial Questions on “Strategic GAPS” tracked under RTE implementation, in Assembly Sessions, on three cardinal RTE aspects viz., “School-TOILET, School Playground and School Library” essential for all Schools statewide.
- The most awaited “Child Labour Tracking Survey under the title of INSTITUTIONAL SURVEY” been recently initiated in May 2017 under the aegis of Dept. of Labour in the State; Survey has been completed in 5no. Districts (Kalahandi, Balesore, Mayurbhanj, Koraput) with the rest continuing; CACLs advocated for inclusion of associated line-Depts. Viz., W & CD and S & ME as host agencies towards facilitating the Study has been accepted and soon to join the Survey in full swing;
- CACL is currently advocating for “Grassroot Non-Institutional Survey instead of Institutional Survey” so as to track the last available vulnerable child.
- State & District-level TASKFORCE activated incorporating CACL members preliminary in the districts of Anugul, Balasore, Mbj, Ganjam, Gajapati, Nabarangapur & Kandhamal.
- District-level convergence of “GO-NGO Initiatives” been activated on “Child safeguard & Protection aspects in Ganjam, Bhadrak & Gajapati districts due to CACL efforts.
- Department of labour has created budget provision for district task force committees.
- A Case against State Govt. Plans & Strategies” has been lodged by CACL with OSCPCR regarding unavailability of above –mentioned infrastructural facilities statewide;
- CACL facilitated series of “Media Advocacies” to highlight all above-mentioned aspects;
- CACL managed escorting a “Team of Experts towards dealing and handling trivial issues at MALKANGIRI Dist. of the state, where the children were affected with the JAPANI FEVER” reported of leading towards more than more than 100nos. of Child casualties at one place in the entire Dist.
- Pressurized under sustained advocacy of CACL – Odisha since last 2yrs., the State Govt. was compelled to introduce “Residential Hostels for Child Labour Victims, Child Beggars and Distressed Children” in Jan’2017 statewide under close surveillance of respective SSA-DPCs, Dept. of S & ME – Govt. of Odisha”.
- CAVC facilitated “Promotion of RTE Cadres in 15 Districts of the State”.

Combating Child Trafficking :

The ISRD endeavors towards promoting a "World free from violence, exploitation, abuse and discrimination against Children. Accordingly, we adopt and reciprocate an indigenously innovative child promotion mechanism - the "5-Step Intervention Mechanism" viz. Rescue, Counselling, Shelter, Legal-Aid and Restoration / Re-Integration. ISRD envisages adopting the approach of 4Ps viz. Prevention, Protection, Prosecution and Partnership to streamline its' strategies partnering with the local administration/like-minded NGOs/CSRs.

12no Bal Shakti Panchyat & 1 Village Child Protection Committees (VCPC) and Children's Clubs dedicated for eliminating child trafficking, / marriage / labor from the Panchayat. Each village develop and implement their own action plan to meet these objectives and assist targeted vulnerable families with access to government social security schemes, safe alternative livelihood and education options.

ISRD has been extending its support for rehabilitation and reintegration of trafficked children or forced into early marriage in the entire district. It thus, advance its' collaboration and advocacy with government and CSOs to advocate for and influence policy re-formulation and law enforcement.

Yellow Ribbon Campaign: Trafficking involves worst forms of Child Abuses in multiple. And Child Abuse in Ganjam district tops the state list. So on, 14th Nov' 2009, ISRD launched the "**Yellow Ribbon Campaign**" under the banner of "**Campaigning against Violence on Children**" to arrest Child Abuse. Yellow Ribbon is a symbol of Community Pledge to never commit, condone and remain silent on abuse and violence against children.

Besides, it has been our level best effort to prevent physical, mental & sexual abuse of children at home, in school, in institution, community etc. A Violence Free Child Friendly District of Ganjam being the mission.

Sensitization of Child Peer Groups

Encourages and riggers Child Participation in manifold activities; helps in hammering and maintaining child enthusiasm. We facilitate and organize various child-centric national and international events /competitions; Children from various Clubs participate in "Children's Dance Festival" on 26th January,2023 in Sanskruti Bhavan, Brahmapur.. 394 no of Children were participated and also national and international child-right-centric days are celebrated for involvement of children. Here children gather, participate, share best practices to safeguard rights of children. Children's Exposure has been organized at times to visit Tourist, Historical Sites, Banks and Railway Platforms to encourage their spirit, knowledge, involvement and smartness.

Dosti Bandhan Save the Girl Child

Starting from 14.11.2022 to 20.11.2022 on the eve of the Child rights week the CHILDLINE Se Dosti & Beti Bachao, Beti Padhao campaign was organized by the ISRD in Ganjam district. The program was inaugurated by Sri Prem Chandra Chaudhary, IAS, Collector & District Magistrate, Ganjam. Different IEC materials on Child rights and Save the girl child was also unfurled by the Collector, Ganjam. Children in groups moved from office to office & typed Dosti band on the wrist of office bearers. The office covered by children was office of the DWO, DCPO, DSWO, DPC, RTE-SSA, DEO, Sub-Collector, Tahsildar, ADM, DIPRO, DCO, DSO etc. Similarly the Save the Girl child Ratha had covered Chatrapur, Brahmapur, Kukudakhandi, Hinjilicut and Rangailunda blocks.

Residential Facility for Tribal & Marginalized Children (BAL ASHRAM)

The Maa Kandhuni Devi (MKD) High School, Gajalbadi in Sorada block of Ganjam is a residential high school founded and undertaken by the ISRD. The high school was established in the year 1996. There is 12 teaching and non-teaching staff. Similarly another ISRD founded high school namely ISRD Budharaja High School is functioning in Ravanaguda of Nawrangpur district. Besides curriculum based academic teaching students are also imparted knowledge on yoga, value, rich cultural heritage of India ETC and provided facilities of lodging and boarding, nutritional support and study care & other amenities of childhood. Pass out children of our school and hostels are pulling on fine in different realms of life.

Bal Ashram, a long term rehabilitation centre, was established in 1996. The *Ashram* is located in Gajalbadi village under Suroda Block of Ganjam district, Odisha. *Bal Ashram's* objective is to impart formal Secondary education alongwith vocational training to children. The *Ashram* also inculcates a deep sense of social justice, gender equity, environmental concern and an understanding of India's rich cultural heritage. So far over **1685** children have undergone rehabilitation at *Bal Ashram* since its inception.

Daily routine of the inmates include reading and learning, amusement, medical treatment, health check up, sports and indoor and outdoor games facility etc. Special attention and coaching is given to the inmates. Students are also imparted training on qualities of leadership and personality development.

One Stop Centre :

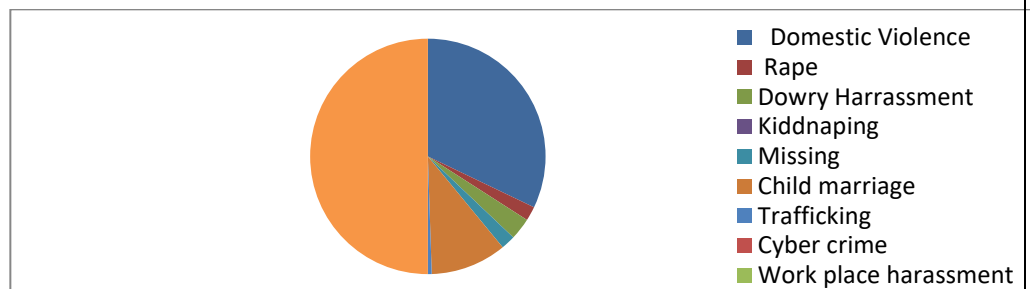
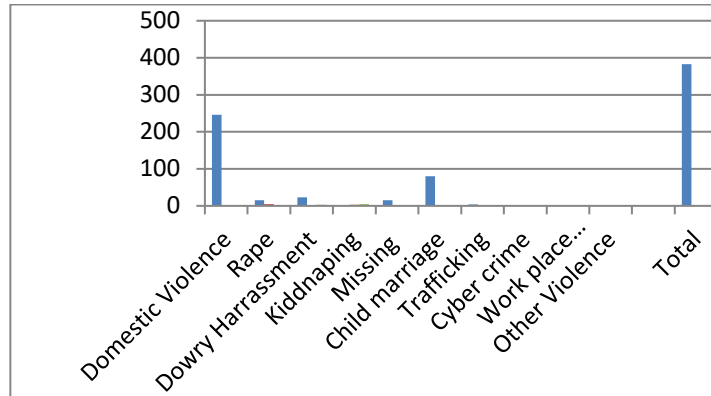
The intention of the One-Stop Centre (OSC) is to support women affected by the violence that they may face within the family or at the workplace or within the community, in private or public places. Emphasis of ISRD on Women and Children could well be marked by its multidimensional ventures. We have been running three numbers of **One Stop Centre program in three districts of Odisha namely Ganjam, Gajapati & Nawrangpur**. The primary objective of the program is to shelter, counsel, provide legal aid, medical treatment to the Women & Children victims. During the year 2022-2023 number of cases handled by the One Stop Centres is as under.

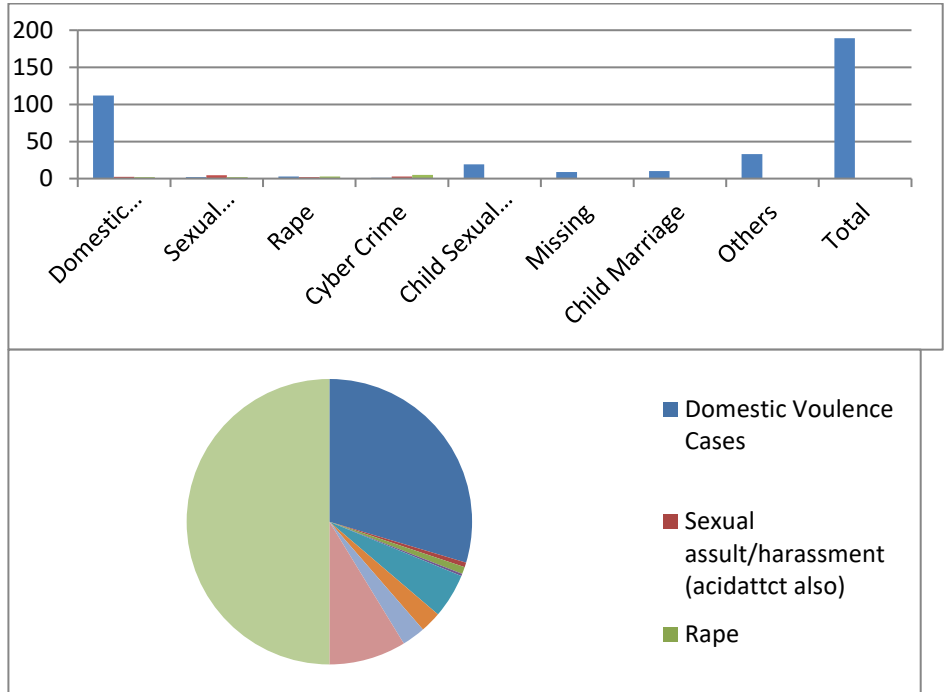
SUCCESS STORY

She got married with a person susant from Nua goan. Susant came to odisha to attend hid brother's marriage function. And he did not pick of the phone. She came to odisha with her child to searching her husband.

- ▶ Osc Action taken-osc provided shelter, psycho social counselling to her. And contacted her husband for couseling.
- ▶ Rehabilitation-After couselling the survivor was handed over to her husband. now they are staying happily with each other.

After misunderstanding the younger Daughter In law (K Vijay Lakshmi) left his children and went alone to his father's house that night. Then after that day she never calls to her husband how her children were leaving?Its Unable to bear the suffering of the children K Vanumati came to OSC office Paralakhemundi on date-15/03/2023, Shewas requested to staff kindly brought back to my younger daughter in law (Ms. K.VijayLakshmi) to be her on home.On that request of 18/03/2023, K Bhanumati's son and many others were called to



understand the mistake of both of them during OSC COUNSELING. After understood they all are agreed to all condition of OSC, if fail in the condition they will be punish with the Govt act. Both parties are signed in understanding letter with witness of their family members and with presence of OSC staff of Paralakhemundi.

And in the last contract, the younger son K, Papa Rao wrote a letter that he will buy the auto given by the elder brother K, Ramesh Rs 3,00,000, (Three Lakh) and he said without drinking alcohol, he will stay happily leave with his parents.

And in the final agreement younger Daughter In law (K Vijay Lakshmi) wrote that she would live happily with his children without quarreling with mother-in-law K Bhanumathi. And according to the mother-in-law's decisionshe will be go her home.

D. Swathi aged around 33, W/o – D. Dayababu aged around 42, At/Po: Bhuskudi, Nua Sahi, P.S- Gurandi, Dist.: Gajapati, suddenly came to SAKHI One Stop Centre, crying shedding tears and made a written submission about her grievance. She had been the victim of physical and mental torture inflicted upon her by her husband, D. Dayababu. She was married to D. Dayababu S/o: D. Chandra of village Bhuskudi in presence of relatives and friends in the year 2012 in accordance with the Hindu marriage rites. During the time of marriage as demanded by D. Dayababu, dowry has been gifted to him. After the marriage was over their marriage related happiness was limited only to 15 days. After that her husband manifested his hidden ugly personality. He started beating her drunk, scolding her in unparliamentary language. Having been drunk he opened up another ugly secret of his personality. He disclosed that he had already been married having two children. Before marriage he had not disclosed it before his wife: D. Swathi keeping this as a top secret he married to her. Getting to know this she experienced a deep sadness. Marriage had been over and hence finding no way out. She managed and adjusted house to the intolerably miserable life. She had to go with whatever life threw upon her. Now she is blessed with two girl children. D. Dayababu's previous wife had faced with the same kind of ugly fate as a result of which she is now staying in her father's house away from her husband. Now her two children have reached the grown-up stage.

As complained by D. Swathi that now her husband drinks in excess, beating her like anything. The fate of the two children is also equally bad. They go uncared for. She used to stay with her husband in Hyderabad. Being beaten and scolded by her husband was a regular phenomenon in Hyderabad. Things were too much and went over her. She was penniless. Having been inflicted with intolerable pain. She came to her father's house, selling her daughter's earrings. Now her two children are also becoming the participants in their mother's bad fate.

Her parents have reached their old age penniless. She lives the life of wants. She is of desire that she wants to live with her husband.

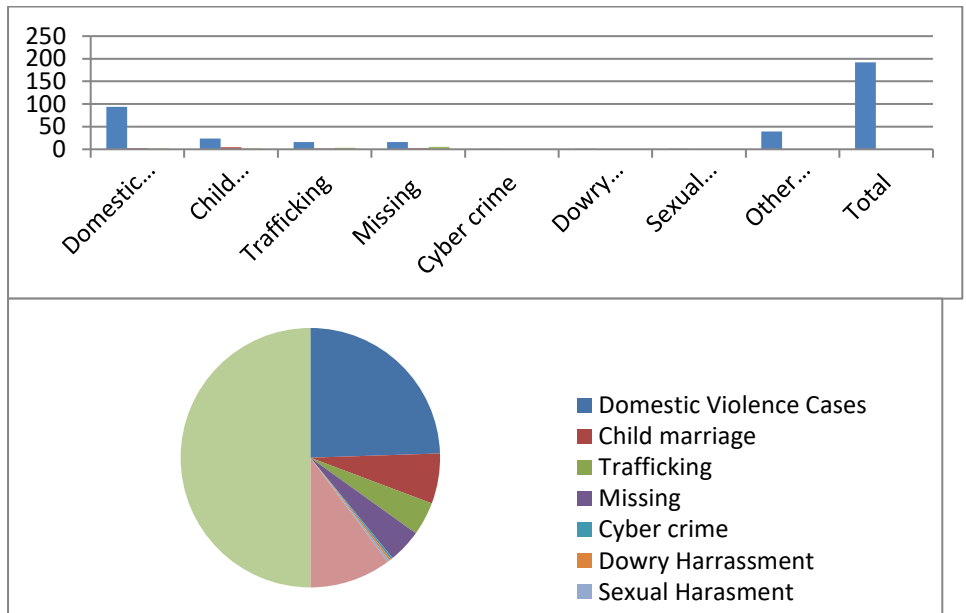
Both the parties were called to the SAKHI One Stop Centre for counseling. The psychological counseling had a positive impact on them. They decided that they should live together, loving each other for ever.

SUCCESS STORY

Neetu Harijan, an aggrieved woman of domestic violence, had a love marriage with Narendra Harijan of Bada Kumari village under Umerkot police station two years ago. The marriage was not accepted by both their families but eventually accepted and Neetu went to live with her in-laws. Neetu's husband works as a lineman. But her husband did not take care of Neetu, her mother-in-law used to torture her by saying that she did not bring her son, and her husband also kept yelling at her saying that she should bring a motorcycle. Among them, when Nitu was pregnant, her body was always sick, so she could not do housework, so there was always a fight between mother-in-law and daughter-in-law. Still Neetu kept quiet thinking about home but got no support even from her husband so she went to her mother's house for delivery. Neetu gave birth to a girl child. A month after the baby was born, Neetu returned home, but her mother-in-law and husband did not taking any care of her and also baby. As her husband did not give time to her or the child, she again went to her father's house. He was forced to keep calling and saying that he would bring the bike and accessories, but he protested against domestic violence in Papadahandi police station. Papadahandi police called both sides and tried to negotiate but failed and sent Sakhi to the center. According to Neetu, she called her husband's family and explained everything, especially since the husband and wife understood each other personally, her husband realized his mistake and promised to keep Neetu apart at home as Neetu and her mother were always fighting. Her mother-in-law also promised to keep Neetu like a daughter. The One Stop Center followed up for the first two days and said that both of them were very happy with the baby.



Swadhar Home (SHAKTI SADAN)

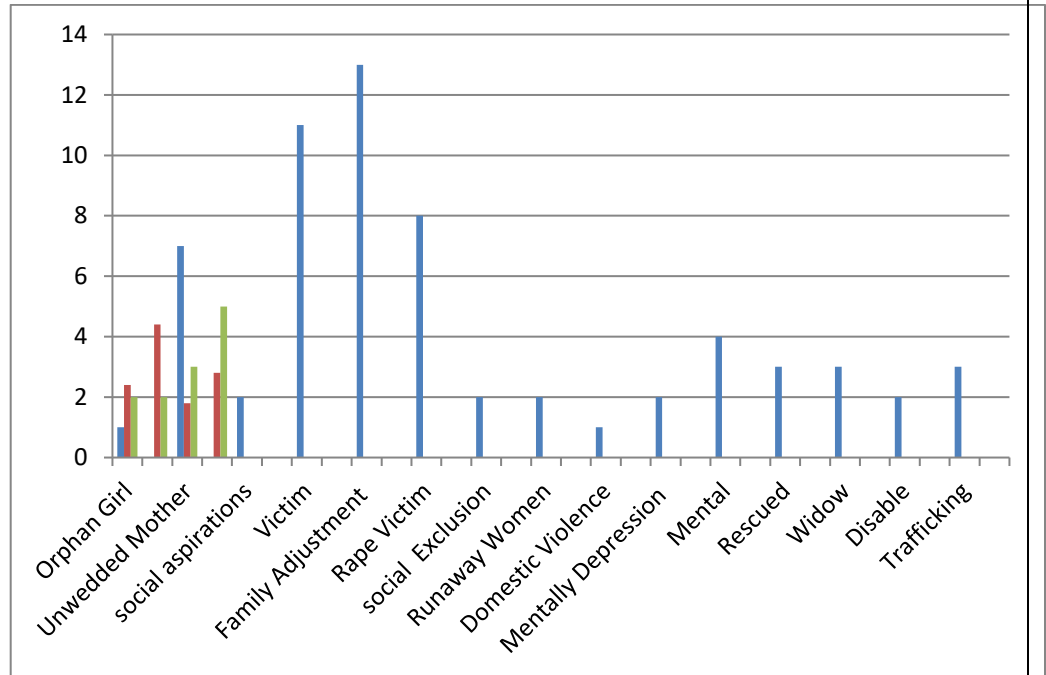
The ISRD has been leading one Swadhar Home at Dabugam in the district of Nabarangpur, Odisha since last two & half decades. During the financial year 2022-2023 average beneficiary per annum in the Swadhar Home with 7 Categories of cases dealt by the Swadhar Home are victim of cruelty, marital maladjustment, woman in moral danger, divorcee, survivors of forced marriage and trafficking referred by the district/local administration or PRI members/CDPOs. They are provided there with nutritional support, clothing, bedding, recreational facilities, legal aid, counseling, income generating & rehabilitative training etc. Vocational training is imparted to the inmates on trades of Agarbati making, tailoring, soft toy, appliqué, coir décor, mushroom cultivation, spices preparation, badi, papad & pickles, candle, detergent preparation etc are given to the inmates. To make them stress & strain free lesson on Yoga is also provided to the inmates. Follows below the month wise position of residents of ISRD Short Stay Home, Dabugam. Category wise case successfully status for the year 2022-2023. Cultural programmes, celebration of festivals, art and craft classes, excursions, educational visits form a part and parcel of life at Swadhar Greh, Dabugam.

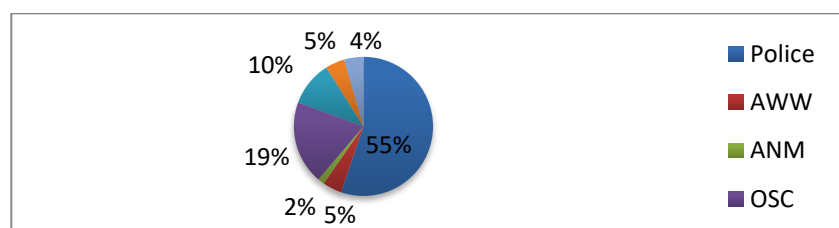

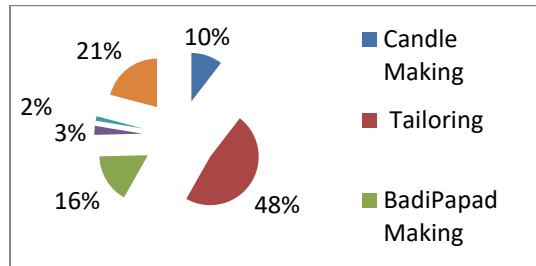

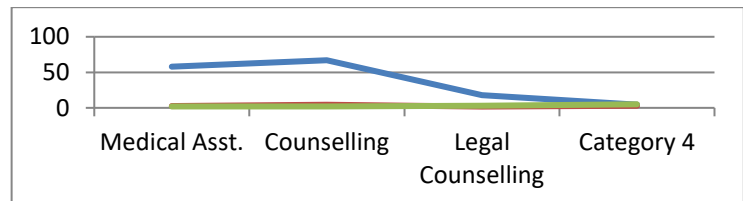

UJJAWALA (Combating Human Trafficking)

Indian Society for Rural Development (ISRD) – a Brahmapur-based NGO from Ganjam District of Odisha has been felicitated with the prestigious **“JEWEL of INDIA Award - 2017”** by **“India Solidarity Council – New Delhi”**. The ceremony being held at **“Menon Bhawan – New Delhi”** was attended by selective alumni’s and conglomerate from diverse sectors and stakeholders across the country. To reckon, **“Jewel of India Award”** is commemorated every year to honour **“Innovative and Disciplinary Activities ushered, both at, organizational as well as individual-end towards streamlining holistic development, innovative, and unparallel paradigms”**. This Year, **“ISRD from Odisha, has been nominated as the Awardee from the “Social Sector”** for its’ extensive contribution towards **“Arresting Human (Child) Trafficking, their Rescue & Rehabilitation along with safeguarding & protection of Child Rights”** at its’ best. A Team of thematic experts visited the operational locale of ISRD in Odisha and submitted their **“Assessment Reports”** favouring its’ final selection. ISRD, since its inception in 1994, has been consistently hitting the news-buzz of every second lead newspaper in Odisha for its’ tremendous achievements in the thematic sector towards **“Protecting & Safeguarding Child Rights”** at length. Recently, from **Feb – May 2017**, ISRD spearheaded the strategic **NCP-CR-Evaluation Assignment** titled **“JJ Mapping Exercise in 13 Districts of Odisha as the State Representative to Childline India Foundation (CIF) – India”**

ISRD comes to limelight in 2006 with its **“24x7 Intervention Services towards arresting and exercising a complete control over the heinous HUMAN (Child) TRAFFICKING Acts”** mushrooming rampantly in Brahmapur and nearby places serving as **“Transit Points”** located at inter-state borders. The Brahmapur City in Ganjam of Odisha, served as the **“TRANSIT POINT paving Women & Child Trafficking”** to southern and North-East of India in a massive-scale. ISRD with its’ innovative intervention has succeeded in rescuing more than 300nos. of Children every year since 1994, and thus, **“serves a BLOW- o JOB the Human Traffickers and Middlemen” winding-up and curbing the rate of trafficking to a standstill state since last 3yrs**. With the interventions of ISRD getting robust and rigorous day-per-day, the traffickers now, most probably, had got shifted their **“Operational EXIT Point”** from Brahmapur, either to **PALASA** in **Andhra Pradesh** or to **Balugaon** in **Odisha**, most adjacently placed Stations on both sides and outskirts of Brahmapur. Besides above, ISRD creates a district-wide sensation for **“Exclusive**

and extensive protection of Child Exploitation & Child Labour through Migration of vulnerable Street Children”, which was all devastating and awe-inspiring. Again, ISRD succeeded in disseminating the awareness on debarring “Child Marriage and fixing 18yrs. as Marriageable Age” accepted charismatically by majority of communities district-wide.

A.Prevention Activities:

ISRD implemented the Ujjawala project in Ganjam district of Odisha in the Year -16. Major objective of the intervention focussed at “Prevention of the heinous Human-Trafficking, especially, Trafficking of Adolescent Girl Children for commercial and Sexual Exploitation”. Brief activities of ISRD Ujjawala program is outlined here-as-under:

➤ **Formation & Strengthening of Community Vigilance Groups**

Extensive sensitization of the previously created Groups have been aimed and extended with requisite newly created Groups been ensured. The Groups, now moreover, are functioning like Child-based “Watchdog Platforms” towards ensuring all vulnerable and need-based children access and avail “Various Components of Human Rights” through programme supportive high-end components those lay solely at the discretion of schematic Govt. Programs and Supports. “Community Vigilance Group Meeting” was held on regular basis on every 1st Sunday in the month. 224 person of 16 CVG Members were quite noteworthy and noticeable on the above-mentioned day and emerged all strategic. Unlike previous events, these events did also highlighted on numerous Child protection perspectives viz., Combating Human Trafficking, Child Exploitation, Child Labour and Migrant Labourers were brought under critical and comprehensive discussion in couple of above-listed meetings

➤ **Strengthening of Balika/ Balak Sanghas**

Inclusive orientation and sensitization of these newly created Groups (Sangha’s) along with some previously created 29 Groups have been strategized with extension of all possible sensitization and orientation supports in optimum. The Groups unlike the previously formed ones, now moreover, functioning as “Child-based & Child-led Watchdog Platforms” towards ensuring all vulnerable and need-based children access and avail “Various Components of Human Rights” through programme supportive high-end components those lay solely at the discretion of schematic Govt. Programs and Supports.

➤ **Meeting of BALAKA /BALIKA Sangha:**

Unlike the previous year’s, this year also, the Balaka /Balika Sangha was categorically convened and did observed the identified regional, national as well as International Days of Importance. The Days’ were equally observed and commemorated through the existing platforms, especially, on occasions viz., “National Girl Child Day (24th Jan), World No Child Labour Day (April 30), World Day against Child Abuse (12th June), Children’s Day (14th Nov) and UNCRC Day Get-to-Gather”. The Pre-Fixed Agenda along with its’ regular Discussion Points have also been floored In the meetings held in this quarter on multiple occasions of Meetings held which are as follows:

Protection of Children from Sexual Offences Act, 2012, the Juvenile Justice (Care and Protection of Children) Act, 2015, the Prohibition of Child Marriage Act, 2006, the Child Labour (Prohibition and Regulation) Act, 1986

➤ **Awareness Generation through cultural activities**

Series of Village-level “Citizenry Awareness-Generation Programs on Human Trafficking & its Disadvantages” have been organized by ISRD through rigorous and extensive staging of “Street Plays” as the most effective “Community Sensitization Media” the details of which has been furnished in the table below. Locally vibrant “Cultural Team led by Sri Balaram Panda” performed the so-called thematic Street Plays for massive awareness generation and information dissemination to the requisite targeted media on thematic aspects of “Violation of Child Rights, Human Trafficking and vicious crimes and its’ aftermath /Consequences with emphasis on Degeneration of present Society and Societal as well as Human Values, Govt. Norms and Policies towards arresting Human Trafficking etc”.

B.RESCUE ACTION

ISRD along with the law enforcement agencies identified and rescued 22 young girls and Children from Railway Station , Brahmapur. These girls belonged to the age group of 07 year to 16 years and were trafficked from Westbengal to Keral Missionary Charity. These girls were trafficked to Keral for prostitution. Moreover, the investigation found that these girls were given oxytocin injection (a growth hormone) to hasten their puberty and push them into prostitution. In the yea conjointly r ISRD & Railway Child Line Staff . 22children were rescued in the year 2022-23.

C. REHABILITATION

In post rescue period of tribal children by proper counseling & consent of the child & her parents as special case by orders of the CWC, Ganjam. All children were main streaming and admitted in School . Childhood was awarded with proper justice by the earnest endeavour of ISRD. Name of the children who were covered under rehabilitative measures follows below.

Local youth groups have been created to play the role of watch dog in combating trafficking. Effort has been made to strengthen the district anti human trafficking unit.

D.REINTEGRATION

Rescued children were provided proper counseling in ISRD. They were made aware on the grave consequences of human trafficking, particularly on health & mind of the victim. Parents of the survivors of trafficking were also sensitized on the ITPA Act, CLPR Act, CMR Act, J.J.Act etc. All of them given written undertaking in CHILDLINE office not to push their children into the gulf of exploitation by the merciless hands of traffickers/middlemen

HEALTH VENTURES

i) Mobile Medicare Unit for Old Age

The Mobile Health Unit of ISRD, Odisha has been operating in Gajapati District. It is meant for the senior citizens who are often neglected & discriminated in the family. Sons and daughters are seen ignoring the aspirations of their old father and mother. So the ISRD MMU program has been addressing to the health issues of old aged persons through its mobile Medicare unit. Health services provided to the senior citizens at their doorstep 629 nos. of older persons treated and total 992 nos. of older persons referral to Govt. Hospital in Gajapati district were benefited by the ISRD Mobile Medicare unit as below:

The physical therapies helps people of all ages who have medical conditions, illnesses or injuries that limit their regular ability to move and function and waiting room We have also take seriously including: Office supplies, Bathroom supplies, Cleaning products for include: Chairs, Brochure displays, Magazine racks, Water cooler, Drinking water etc We have also take seriously including: Office supplies, Bathroom supplies, Cleaning products .A customized physical therapy program can help individuals return to their prior level of functioning, and encourage activities and lifestyle changes that can help prevent further injury and improve overall health and well being. Physiotherapy reduce pain, avoid surgery, improve mobility, improve balance & prevent falls, manage diabetes & vascular conditions, manage age related issues, manage heart & lung diseases etc.

Similarly by the Yoga training we are attempting to revive the traditional health practices. Yoga heals people out of stress & strain, depression. There are professional Yoga teachers engaged by the ISRD. In the year 2022-2023 totally 571 nos. of patient were benefited by the physiotherapy & yoga centre of ISRD.

STRENGTHENING OF LOCAL SELF GOVERNANCE

ISRD has been conducting 507 nos of PRI / Urban representatives Training for their Role , Responsibility & Accountability with the support of Govt. of Odisha for the year 2022-23.. Since 2009, ISRD has been to promote local economic development, social justice, and infrastructure development. The various functions of the local government include: to build basic infrastructure like transport, roads, power lines, schools, hospitals, etc. including key considerations for occupational Safety and Security the front line of the outbreak response and as such are exposed to hazards that put them at risk of infection. Hazards include pathogen exposure, long working

hours, psychological distress, fatigue, occupational burnout, stigma, and physical and psychological violence. This document highlights the rights and responsibilities of health workers, including the specific measures needed to protect occupational safety and health.

ISRDR usually strategized repeating this inventory exercise twice and thrice a year in different zones and locales in undivided Ganjam Dist., now geographically recognized as duo-Districts viz., Ganjam and Gajapati District. ISRDR, in-association with LSG administration, have started collaborative initiatives towards sensitizing and orienting its' operational communities on prospective dynamics of getting skilled with wide range of existing and newer demandable Skills of sustainable "Livelihood & Income Generation Approaches" those need to be adopted as permanent Occupations for making a living & lifestyle. The Process is all active and still in continuance as one "Best-Practice" to track and mobilise the requisite target Groups to get skilled for handling the "Natural Flora" in-abundance for effective usage by the human-race and its' sustainability thereafter. Moreover, the endeavour primarily targeted at "Bringing equilibrium to the Supply demand scenario existing in a particular market-based setting by facilitating flow of requisite human resources to ensure accountability as Service delivery entities to offer and fulfill common requirements needed in day-to-day life through market-based approach with ample commercial dividends in-return.

SKILL DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM

To improve livelihoods and income of Women through enterprises, marketing, and value chain interventions by Women Self Help Groups. It's implemented in a cluster approach with clusters being a number of contiguous patches of 10 Accra land each. 32 accra land covered in 2-3 patches in a Ranajhali & Gangadohani Gram Panchyat of Purushotampur Block, Ganjam district, Odisha where 82 HHs are covered. Scale of the programme is mentioned below:

Within the clusters, integration of different production systems such as Agriculture & Horticulture promotion of improved agronomic, practices, crop diversification and intercropping, soil health management, community managed seed systems, promotion of vegetable cultivation for nutrition security, localized production etc. with "farmer to farmer" learning forming core implementation strategy.

ISRDR Skill Development Centre, Jodamba, Gajapati district & Jaganathapur of Ganjam district are reaching to the unreached areas to cater the needs of the poorest of the poor and work at the door step of the beneficiaries with a minimum infrastructure and resources and provide vocational skills in non-formal mode to non-literate, neo-literates, persons with rudimentary level of education upto 8th and school drop-outs upto 12th standard in the **age group of 15-45 years**. The priority groups are women, SC, ST, minorities and other backward sections of the society.

In the year April 2022 to March 2023, 103 children received training informal education, non-formal education, vocational training and personality development at ISRDR SKILL DEVELOPMENT CENTRE, Jodamba of Gajapati district & Jaganathapur of Ganjam district. Beside this, Tailoring, Diploma in Computer Application, Mobile Repairing and electrician's are the other trades taught at the centre.

Financial Literacy Programs for SHGs and Youths

The simple, easy-going rustic folklore based in the pro-tribal rural settings of the duo-districts are continuously being incubated for recognizing accurate and appropriate economic and financial dynamics towards adopting sustainable **“Income Generation Practices and Vocations /Occupations for Livelihood Sustainability (IGLS)”**. Accordingly, these target groups are offered comprehensive orientation & sensitization programs for friendly and effective learning, simply, on recording their Income & Expenditures, doing easy mathematic Calculations and recording requisite Figures as memory for reference and instant use, learning simple Banking & Commercial Transactions and gaining knowledge on economically beneficial govt. Poverty-alleviation Schemes & Programs etc.

Career Counseling & Youth/Artisan Placement

Artisan and Skilled Trainee Engagement or Placement brings in the requisite “Turning-Point in the Skill-based and Entrepreneur Development Training curricula”, that is the top-most and vital aspect that emerges as the Output with the entire incubation process. It is the most sensitive phase, whereby, a Trainee gathers all potentials to unleash the same through establishment of some micro, small or medium Enterprise. On the other hand, the same Trainee or group of Trainees launch the expedition in-quest of an engagement with some Entrepreneurial Unit /House, with some rural /local or outdoor industry for his /her placement accordingly.

ISRD, accordingly, organized a number of “Career Counselling and Placement /Engagement Exercises” at both the ends, viz., held dialogues with Entrepreneurial Units /Industries for assessing their emerging needs & requirements, and on the other hand, it discussed with the Trained-Hands for their engagement based on their personal preferences to the type of Work /Labour, Pay-Perks and Returns /Dividends, Distance from Home etc., so as to ensure its’ mediary role-play for greater benefit of the Trained Human Resource.

Forest Management & Biodiversity Conservation

The ISRD also works on land rights of tribal population of Sorada block Ganjam. We coordinate with the local administration to ensure issue of homestead land patta&cultivable land patta to the tribal people. Sensitization programs organized on tribal people right to water, forest & land &community-based management of biodiversity. As they cannot depend on forest products throughout the year so at regular intervals forest living tribal people are imparted skill training on alternative livelihood options like rice puff unit, poultry, kitchen garden, medicinal garden, goatery etc.

Being a champion of National Youth Project & seriously concerned with the present day environment pollution the ISRD has been regularly campaigning to generate wide spread mass awareness on saving the environment & saving the human civilization from extinction.
